We had an avg of 13.9 Fisherman per competition this year. With a total number of 774 fish being caught and a total weight of 293kg.

On the Offshore side of things, we had 4 comps this year with a total of 73 fish caught and a total weight of 58.48kg.

Some big fish caught this season; Gold Band Snapper 4.65kg, Mach Tuna 3.27kg, Pearl Perch 2.06kg and not mention that Cod - what was the weight of that Cod? Things were close in B Grade this year with less than one point between winner and runner up in both Champion and Day Champion [shore comp].
