It was decided that the first competition be held on July 19th, the committee to draw up the conditions. Trophies were promised by Messrs. J. O'Connell and A. G. Sturgess. It was decided that the competitors weigh in at J. O'Connell's.

The recently founded Southport Amateur Fishing Club held its initial competition at the week-end when ten members participated in the outing which was held at Stradbroke Island. Len. Bocher was captain for the day, and he signalised the occasion by catching heavest fish a silver bream

which turned the scale at 23lbs...

The nine competitors who weighed in were responsible for a catch of 88 fish aggregating 68lbs. Gordon Malt man had the biggest basket and his 22 fish weighed 14-lbs; he received 501 points. Mr. R. Middleton was second, his basket of 15 turning the scale at 12lbs. The points gained by him were 39, and R. Johnston who came third with 13 fish weighing 93 lbs., and he was awarded 521 points.
