

REPORT

Not as good a year as 2022 with a total of 774 fish and weight of 293kg. This year we had a total catch of 663 fish with a weight of 228.5kg.

Total number of Bream 408, Cod 2, Dart 11, Flathead 7, Garfish 61, Grunter 1, Jew 1, Mangrove Jack 5, Morwong 2, Moses Perch 12, Pike 5, Sole 1, Tarwine 9 Tailor 17, Teragin Jew 9, Trevally 2, Whiting 104, Hairtail 1, Slimy Mackerel 4.

One of the fish fought back this year and hooked one of our members and sent him on a trip to the hospital for a couple of hours. He managed to come back and be one of the top two of the comp.

Offshore:

Three people fished and we managed to catch the same number of fish on a couple of trips so it came down to the weight. We caught 35 fish in total, weight of 56kg. The three best fish were Cobia one at 13.52kg and 13.3kg, 9.62kg.
